In April 2019, I was getting married to a man I thought was the love of my life, hoping that our love was a forever kind of story. However, by August 2020, I was back at my parents' house, nursing a newborn baby girl and grappling with the reality that I might soon have to deal with a failed marriage—a reality that, unfortunately, became true very soon after.

It was 2020, which meant that, apart from the reality of a very short-lived nuptial bliss, I had to juggle first-time motherhood alone because he chose to completely walk away. I also faced unemployment due to the Covid-19 pandemic and all the shame that comes with being a PK (Preacher's Kid)—a Christian lady who now bears the title of "divorced." It was tough, a swim-or-sink kind of situation. What a dramatic introduction to the first installment from someone you don't even know, right?



Early Education and Career Struggles

I matriculated in 2013 at All Saints College in Phalaborwa, where I passed with a Bachelor's pass. After high school, I faced a challenge: I couldn't get a space at a higher learning institution. In 2014, I decided to take a gap year. During this time, I watched my peers go off to universities, leaving me behind. Out of frustration, I enrolled at Sir Val Duncan (Mopani College) to study Fitting and Turning (Engineering N2).

However, my time in the engineering program wasn't successful. While I passed Mathematics and Science, I failed the other modules. I realized that this was not the right path for me. Despite the setbacks, I didn't give up on pursuing my career.

New Beginnings: Marketing

In 2015, I still didn't secure a place at a university, so I turned to Capricorn FET College to study Marketing. I completed my Marketing Diploma in 2017. However, even though I finished my studies, I still didn't feel passionate about it. I was studying because I loved learning, not because I had found my true calling.

A Turning Point: God's Timing

In 2018, I had a revelation: my life aligned with Isaiah 60:22, "When the time is right, I, the Lord, will make it happen." After four years of navigating my career and facing disappointments, I enrolled at Tshwane University of Technology in 2018 to study a Diploma in Public Administration (NQF 6). I successfully completed it in 2020.

SCRIPTURAL REFERENCE (1 CORINTHINS13 VS 4-8; JOHN 3 VS 16; ROMANS 5 VS 1-5 AND 8 VS 37 -39; JAMES1 VS 2-4 1JOHN4 VS 16)

The LOVE of God is a topic close to my heart. Even as I write, I speak from firsthand testimony of its existence. Despite what I have seen, felt, experienced, and encountered in life, I cannot propose otherwise. The validity, authenticity, and practicality of any proposition or position should not be tested externally but rather from one's own personal life's crucible.

What's evident, even though the LOVE of God is real, true, and unfading, is that the belief that God LOVES you is almost always under severe attack, challenge, and contestation. What I have discovered as I go through life's woes is that I am kept in a relationship with God not on account of how much I love Him, but because of how much God has LOVED

Many times, as a result of what we have faced, we end up believing that God has forsaken us or does not LOVE us anymore. This is due to misconceptions about the ramifications of being LOVED by God. A false belief is equating the LOVE of God to one's well-being—assuming that if God LOVES me, I will never suffer, experience pain, sorrow, death, misery, loss, or grief. The unshakable truth is that the LOVE OF GOD exists both in and outside of what we may consider suffering.

That which we face, seemingly negating the LOVE of God, is often a result of elements outside of His LOVE. Hence, what we endure cannot, in any way, alter or halt the LOVE that God has for us.

As we unpack the LOVE of God, we must deal with the following questions:

If living in the best condition on earth is not the purpose, then why does God LOVE us?

God LOVES because of who He is, how He wants us to know Him, and how He desires to be known through us.

When I asked myself what the LOVE of God is, I found it more difficult to define than I initially thought. The more I tried to define it, the more I realized it does not fit into a single definition. It is dynamic, layered, and multi-faceted. When Paul described it, he outlined what it is, what it is not, what it does, what it always is, and ended by stating that it never ends. Thus, I summarize that LOVE is more than a feeling, similar to fear, hatred, anger, or jealousy. It is more of a Person—and that Person is Jesus.

What's the benefit to you? Why should one accept the LOVE of God? True benefit can only be appreciated by a heart that longs for God. Any and all efforts from God in demonstrating His LOVE will be despised until one is desperate for Him. Thus, the greatest and highest benefit of His LOVE is being in a relationship with Him.

LOVE is the essence of His person; it remains one of the pivotal elements of our faith. Of all the things one might doubt, the LOVE of God should never be one of them. After all has passed, all is done, and all is seen, His enduring LOVE will forever remain steadfast.
